The class used textbooks to cover the basic points, but the class focused on current events and engaging the students in conversations built around the news.

Fall 2011: Taught News Editing class to undergraduates. Discussiondriven class focused on how the fundamentals of journalism relate to today's changing news environment. Class focuses on AP Style and balanced and accurate reports, but also includes intense conversations about how news is consumed in the current environment and how media organizations must reach people in new ways. For example, one lively class came when I had the students deliver plans to cover Sept. 11 if it had happened today.
