Photographer Jim Wallace will discuss the Civil Rights movement in Chapel Hill and his new book, "Courage in the Moment: The Civil Rights Struggle, 1961-1964," in a free, public event on the UNC campus.

The book features more than 100 photographs, most of them previously unpublished, that Wallace captured while he was a journalism student and a photographer for The Daily Tar Heel. The images document events including marches, sit-ins, a Ku Klux Klan rally in Orange County and the 1963 March on Washington.

Jim Wallace, a journalism school alumnus and member of its board of advisers, graduated from UNC in 1964. He retired in 2003 from the Smithsonian Institution where he had served as director/curator of Imaging and Photographic Services, supervising photographers in the National Museum of American History, National Museum of Natural History and the National Air and Space Museum. He is a member of the National Press Photographers Association and the White House News Photographers Association.
